

J'aime les personnes qui portent ...

Goal: To practice French colour and/or clothing vocabulary

Supplies:

- Chairs
- Word wall of colour and/or clothing vocab (optional if the words have been reviewed a lot)

How to Play:

1. Make a circle of chairs facing inward, with one chair less than the total number of people.
2. Everyone sits on a chair in the circle, except one person who stands in the middle.
3. The person in the middle will say “J’aime les personnes qui portent ____” (I like people who wear) and then name a colour or an article of clothing that they are wearing.
 - a. Ex. “J’aime les personnes qui portent la couleur bleue”
 - b. Ex. “J’aime les personnes qui portent des chapeaux”
4. Everyone seated in the circle wearing that colour or clothing item has to get up and change chairs with the others who are also moving.
5. Similar to musical chairs, there is one more person than there are chairs, so the person who does not get a chair will go to the middle of the circle, and repeat “J’aime les personnes qui portent _____”.

Other rules:

- You cannot sit down in your own chair again
- No running or pushing
- You can't say the same colour or article of clothing twice in a row
- If nobody sitting has the colour/clothing named, the person in the middle should say another statement

Variation:

- If you learn negatives, students could change the sentence to be “J’aime les personnes qui **ne** portent **pas** _____” (I like people who are not wearing).
- This could be modified to fit any vocabulary by using “aiment” or “mangent” instead of “portent”. For example, “J’aime les personnes qui aiment le soccer” or “J’aime les personnes qui mangent le chocolat”.
